**OBJECTIVE:** To build a common understanding on how to design and operationalize sustainable landscape management programs that contribute both to rural development and to greenhouse gas emission reductions. The workshop will focus on high level strategic issues related to program design and implementation, including country political commitments, establishing a program ‘vision’ that is fully integrated with the national development agenda, aligning multiple partners and stakeholder for program delivery, and incentive structures for results-based payments. The participants will be mainly African technical leaders, who serve as counterparts to the World Bank’s BioCarbon Fund (BioCF) and Forest Carbon Partnership Facility (FCPF) and are involved with managing jurisdictional REDD+ programs through their respective line ministries.
